TNFW ACCOMPLISHES ITS MISSION BY MEASUREABLE AND SUSTAINABLE ACTION:

- Managing three nature preserves, over 30 miles of hiking trails, a 1,400-acre Crawfords Knob Natural Area Preserve, and over 6,000 acres of ancient ecosystems.
- Providing hands-on environmental education programs to 2,000 area K-12 students annually.
- Sponsoring hikes, lectures, field trips, and workshops for over 2,000 life-long learners annually.
- Conserving our ecosystem through wildlife studies, water quality and stream monitoring, invasive species monitoring, and native plant propagation.
- Hosting research that informs best practices for managing Wintergreen's ecosystem and contributes to the scientific community's body of knowledge.
- Partnering with our local communities to protect and preserve Wintergreen's and our Central Blue Ridge region's natural and cultural heritage.
